Every parent everywhere: "How was school today?"

Every child everywhere: "Fine."

One of my biggest suggestions to families is to think about the questions you ask your children when they get home. A general question like, "How was your day?" often elicits a general answer like, "Fine." What you ask can help children look for the positives in their day. Questions can help them think about their behavior and their choices. What you ask can foster behaviors you hope to see. Maybe that is kindness to others, persevering when something is hard, helping a friend who is struggling, helping be a problem-solver, recognizing when they need to ask for help, etc.!

- 1. Did you fill someone's bucket today? Did someone fill yours?
- 2. Who did you sit with at lunch?
- 3. Did you help anyone today? How?
- 4. Tell me something you learned today that you didn't know yesterday.
- 5. What made you feel proud?
- 6. When did you need help today? What did you do?
- 7. Does everyone have a friend at recess?
- 8. What would you like to learn more about at school?
- 9. What is the best thing that happened today?

10. If I called your teacher, what would she/he tell me about you as a student and as a friend?

Try a few! Moving beyond "fine" happen at all ages with the right questions!

PSD will follow the <u>state health department's new "How Sick</u> <u>is Too Sick" protocols</u>

If you have any of the symptoms listed....You need a negative <u>COVID test to return to school.</u> Symptoms that require a negative test to return to school include fever, feeling feverish, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, sore throat, runny nose, congestion, muscle/body aches, headache, fatigue, new loss of sense of taste or smell.

If your student tests positive or chooses not to test, they must remain home for five days and wear a mask on days 6 to 10 when they return, per public health requirements.

HEALTH OFFICE REMINDERS:

Please turn in updated immunization records to the health office.

MEDICATION REMINDER: All medications given at school must have new authorization forms every year. Please contact Ms. Thompson in the health office (970/488-5855) with any questions.

Medical Exemptions: Starting July 1, 2016, parents/guardians seeking non-medical (religious or personal belief) exemptions for children in Kindergarten – 12th Grade must submit non-medical exemption forms annually. Medical exemptions only need to be submitted once and require the signature of your child's doctor or ad-

vanced practice nurse. To submit a nonmedical or medical exemption use the forms below;
