HAPPY SPRING!

It is really hard to imagine that it is almost April and there are around 40 days of school left. What a unique year this has been! This time of year is busy with lots of planning for the next school year. We are currently planning staffing, looking at schedules, and will start the class placement process. We are also working on all "end of year" activities to determine what we can do safely.

You have probably heard that PSD is down almost 1,000 students. MOST of those are at the elementary level. This is having an impact on so many of our schools, including Linton. Our neighborhood enrollment has dropped. This impacts how much money we have to hire staff. We will likely be two sections of K, 1st, and 2nd, and 3 sections 3rd-5th grade. Our two section classes still have a class size of 20-22.

As we look ahead to typical May activities, there will have to be a lot of adjustments in order to still provide the experiences for our students. I know you really want the activities to continue, even if it means they will look different! The biggest difference will be the activities **will be only for the teacher and students.** We must still maintain our cohorts and keep all safety measures in place. This will include any end-of-year picnics, parties, modified field day, and celebrations. We ARE working out a plan to honor our 5th graders in a way that parents can be included in some way.

It will be important to read communications from school over the next few months! We will be sharing spring plans and next year information.

<u>CMAS:</u> The Colorado Measures of Academic Success test typically assesses the areas of math, reading (English Language Arts) in grades 3 – 5 and science for grade 5. The state submitted a waiver request that was just ap-

proved to condense the assessment for this year, limiting the areas each child would be assessed in. We will administer fewer tests over a shorter amount of time – please see the details per grade below. We thank you for trying to avoid appointments or absences on these dates.

April 20th – April 22nd

3rd grade: English Language Arts/reading test – 3 sessions over 3 days

4th grade: Mathematics test – 3 sessions over 3 days

5th grade: English Language Arts/reading test – 3 sessions over 3 days
