Current Safety Measures

Many of you have asked what health and safety precautions we have in place this year. We have been able to relax a few things, and also have many of the same practices in place.

- Our seating needs to be three feet apart. We are able to seat students in small groups, as long as the "3 feet" is in place.
- Lunch in the lunchroom! Students will be the same "groups" as in the classroom, with assigned seats, and additional spacing. We will eat outside whenever possible!
- We are eating lunch first so hands can we washed in the classroom. Recess is after lunch.
- o Special's teachers are also using the classroom groups in their spaces.
- o Hand washing multiple times a day.
- o Clubs/after school or before school offerings will be available and will follow the same safety procedures. We will add the offerings to the parent email/phone call each week, as they get scheduled.
- o We are not able to accommodate family members at lunch or breakfast. There simply is no room with the required spacing and tracing!
- o Any volunteer, so far, will be doing clerical work or Friday folders outside of the classroom. Volunteers will not be working with students.
- o If we schedule any family events, they will need to be held outside.



Free meals during the 2021-22 school year

Thanks to an extension of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's school district reimbursement program, PSD will once again offer free meals to any enrolled PSD student during the 2021-22 school year. Ala carte items will once again be sold at secondary schools.

Families are encouraged to apply for Free and Reduced meals for the coming school year starting on August 1, 2021. Those who qualify for benefits are eligible for school fee/charge waivers.

When your student goes through the breakfast or lunch line, they will need to put in their students ID numbers. This is the same number they have been using to log into their computers. However, since we have been off all summer – we are asking for your help in making sure our students know their ID numbers. Please use the attached PIN Pad to practice at home. Fee Waivers

Families who qualify for free/reduced school meals, may also be eligible for waivers for certain school fees.

Information regarding a student's free/reduced meal status is extremely confidential. Therefore, families must give PSD permission to share this information with staff that need it by completing the *Permission to Share Information for Fee Waivers and Programs to Receive Goods and Services* form. This form is available electronically through ParentVUE (in the left side navigation - select FORMS.) Please note: You must fill out and submit a *Permission to Share* form every year to be considered.

To have certain school fees waived, families must:


1. Be approved to receive free or reduced-price meals; and Complete the *Permission to Share Information for Fee Waivers and Programs to Receive Goods and Services* (available through ParentVUE – select FORMS on the left side navigation). You must submit the form every year.

Visit the <u>Parent page</u> on the PSD website for more information about ParentVUE, SchoolPay, Free and Reduced Lunch Applications and the Permission to Share Form. Please contact your school with any questions.

To receive text messages from the school or district, parents must have an active SMS number on file in Synergy AND opt-in to receive text messages via their mobile carrier.

o To opt-in via your mobile phone, text "YES" to 67587 and you will receive a confirmation message.

HEALTH OFFICE REMINDERS:

MEDICATION REMINDER: All medications given at school must have new authorization forms every year. Please contact Mrs. Clark in the health office (970/488-5855) with any questions.

KINDERGARTEN IMMUNIZATION REMINDER: Now that we are back in school, we need the most up to date immunization records for your students. Many children received vaccinations over the summer, after our registration period. Please bring a copy of your child's current immunization record to the health office or ask your doctor to fax it to 970-488-5852

Medical Exemptions: Starting July 1, 2016, parents/guardians seeking non-medical (religious or personal belief) exemptions for children in Kindergarten – 12th Grade must submit non-medical exemption forms annually. Medical exemptions only need to be submitted once and require the signature of your child's doctor or advanced practice nurse. To submit a non-medical or medical exemption use the forms below;

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Welcome to the 2021-2022 School Year! <u>Acadience Reading</u>...formally called DIBELS. You may hear it referred to as either, or Acadience DIBELS. This is our quick reading assessment that classroom teachers and/or literacy interventionists give three times a year. We want you to know that students are testing now through September 3rd (kindergarten has a longer window through October 14th).

Child in 2nd - 5th? Read on...

<u>NWEA MAPs</u> – The district MAPs Reading and Mathematics assessments will be held now through September 24th. Teachers will be sharing with families more information as to which dates testing will occur. Each test takes approximately one hour, is not timed, and is sometimes done over more than one session.
