Thoughts From Your Principal...

Every parent everywhere: "How was school today?"

Every child everywhere: "Fine."

One of my biggest suggestions to families is to think about the questions you ask your children when they get home. A general question like, "How was your day?" often elicits a general answer like, "Fine." What you ask can help children look for the positives in their day. Questions can help them think about their behavior and their choices. What you ask can foster behaviors you hope to see. Maybe that is kindness to others, persevering when something is hard, helping a friend who is struggling, helping be a problem-solver, recognizing when they need to ask for help, etc.!

- 1. Did you fill someone's bucket today? Did someone fill yours?
- 2. Who did you sit with at lunch?
- 3. Did you help anyone today? How?
- 4. Tell me something you learned today that you didn't know yesterday.
- 5. What made you feel proud?
- 6. When did you need help today? What did you do?
- 7. Does everyone have a friend at recess?
- 8. What would you like to learn more about at school?
- 9. What is the best thing that happened today?
- 10. If I called your teacher, what would she/he tell me about you as a student and as a friend?

Try a few! Moving beyond "fine" happen at all ages with the right questions!

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Free meals during the 2021-22 school year

Thanks to an extension of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's school district reimbursement program, PSD will once again offer free meals to any enrolled PSD student during the 2021-22 school year.

Families are encouraged to apply for Free and Reduced meals for the coming school year starting on August 1, 2021. Those who qualify for benefits are eligible for school fee/charge waivers.

When your student goes through the breakfast or lunch line, they will need to put in their student ID number. This is the same number they have been using to log into their computers. However, since we have been off all summer – we are asking for your help in making sure our students know their ID numbers. If your child does not know their number, please log into your ParentVue or call the front office at 970/488-5850 or Ms. Kathia at 970/488-5913.

If your child plans to purchase a MILK ONLY at lunch, this is an AI a Carte item and will cost the student 50 cents. Please load money onto your SchoolPay account if your child needs to purchase milk. The kitchen is not able to accept any cash.

MEDICATION REMINDER: All medications given at school must have new authorization forms every year. Please contact Mrs. Clark in the health office (970/488-5855) with any questions.


KINDERGARTEN IMMUNIZATION REMINDER: Now that we are back in school, we need the most up- to -date immunization records for your students. Many children received vaccinations over the summer, after our registration period. Please bring a copy of your child's current immunization record to the health office or ask your doctor to fax it to 970-488-5852.

Medical Exemptions: Starting the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, parents/guardians seeking non-medical (religious or personal belief) exemptions for children in kindergarten – 12th Grade must submit non-medical exemption via the Department of Public Health & Environment. Parents must complete the non-medical exemption annually. Follow the link below:

Return to learn guidance

For students and staff returning to work or school in PSD following a positive COVID-19 symptom screen, PSD follows the <u>CDPHE Return to Learn guidance for K-12 schools.</u> The Spanish version is available here: <u>Español CDPHE Return to Learn Guidance.</u>

A group of nurses and PSD staff evaluated the guidance that outlines when staff and students can return to work and school.

Note: This guidance is NOT intended for cases or close contacts of COVID-19. A confirmed COVID-19 case or close contact should follow public health isolation or quarantine instructions for return to school/work.

Major symptoms


- Feeling feverish, having chills, temperature of 100.4 F or greater
- New or worsening cough
- Loss of taste or smell
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

Major symptom response:


- If symptoms resolve within 24 hours of onset, follow regular return to school illness policies.
- If symptoms DO NOT resolve within 24 hours, either:
- o Follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.

Get a PCR or molecular COVID-19 test. If the test is negative, return to school once symptom-free. If positive, follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.

- Sore throat
- Runny nose or congestion
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Nausea, vomiting
- Diarrhea

Minor symptom response:

- If symptoms resolve within 24 hours of onset, follow regular return to school illness policies.
- If symptoms resolve within 48 hours of onset, follow regular return to school illness policies.
- If symptoms DO NOT resolve within 48 hours, either:
- o Follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.
- o Get a PCR, or molecular COVID-19 test. If the test is negative, return to school once symptom-free. If positive, follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.

If there are questions about when a student can return to school, the school nurse or PSD health staff will make that determination.
