Ever wonder what goes into placing students in classrooms for the following year? ### SCHOOL NEWS

The last day of school will be Wednesday, May 25<sup>th</sup>. Students will be dismissed at 12:00 PM.

- If your child has medication at school, it must be picked up by 12:00 PM on Wednesday, May 25<sup>th</sup>. Any medication left at school will be disposed of by our school nurse per Poudre School District policy.
- Report cards will be available for parents to review in their ParentVue account.
- Important information about the start of the 2022-2023 school year will be sent home and posted on the Linton webpage at the beginning of August. The first day of school will be Tuesday, August 16th, 2022.
- Incoming kindergarten students please refer to your summer letter from the kindergarten team for your assessment day.

- All parents will need to access ParentVue in August to sign the Code of Conduct for Poudre School District for the 2022-2023 school year.

Colorado law (Board of Health rule 6 CCR 1009-2) requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed childcares to be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed. The minimum number and spacing of doses is set forth in the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) Child and Adolescent Immunization Schedules. Meeting the initial vaccine requirements does not excuse a student from meeting additional requirements. In addition to the vaccines required for school entry, there are several vaccines recommended by the ACIP that provide protection against other diseases. These include Meningococcal, Hepatitis A, Rotavirus, Human papillomavirus and Influenza.

Below are the vaccines required for students attending Colorado licensed childcares and schools. More information is available here: Child Care | School.

Vaccines required to enter school (K-12)

- Hepatitis B.
- Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (DTap).\*
- Inactivated poliovirus (IPV).\*
- Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR).\*
- Varicella (chicken pox).\*

HEA

Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis (Tdap).\*\*

\*Students 4 through 6 years of age are required to have their final doses of DTaP, IPV, MMR and Varicella prior to kindergarten entry.

\*\*Students are required to have Tdap prior to entry into 6th grade. One dose of Tdap is required for 6th through 12th grades.

### Exemptions

- Medical exemptions only need to be submitted once.
- If a non-medical exemption is selected, it must be submitted annually for students K-12.
- Options for submitting medical and non-medical exemptions can be found on the Vaccine exemptions page. www.colorado.gov/vaccineexemption.

End of the Year Medication Pickup: Dear Parents/Guardians,

Medications cannot be sent home with students at the end of the school year.

• Parents must pick up all medications on or before 12:00 PM on the last day of school (5/25/2022). REMINDER: the last day of school is a half day.

• If medications need to be picked up before the last day of school, make arrangements with the school nurse or health tech.

• Emergency or as-needed medications (Epi-pens, Tylenol, Inhalers, etc.) must also be picked up, please make a plan with your school health office.

• The school nurse will follow state health department procedures and dispose of all medications not picked up by parent/guardian by 12:00 PM on 5/25/2022.

If medications will be brought back to the school in the fall, you may obtain a medical authorization form from the health tech in your school, or on the PSD website. If you have any questions, please contact your school nurse or health tech 970-488-5855.
