A strong community and strong communication is very important to us. Please call our office any time you need help. Ms. Benedict (our assistant principal) and I are outside at drop off or dismissal and are happy to help in any way. On a weekly basis, you will receive a phone message and email that will prepare you for the following week at school. You will also receive consistent communication from your classrooms.

Your VERY best connection at Linton is your classroom teacher. If you have questions, if you are confused by a schedule, want to discuss some difficulties your child is having, or just want to verify something your child reported....contact your teacher. Your teachers are able to help and are with your child the majority of the day. They will know about any accidents, any conflicts, or any struggles a child might have had. Please connect with your **teacher first and ask for clarification**. We often find that students share some or part of a story when they get home, and the teacher can fill in missing pieces.

If you have other concerns or questions this year, there is a reference for how to get support on the next page.

We are thrilled to be back in session. At Linton, we take care of your children like they are our own. Thank you for sharing your children with us!

School News

The Free/Reduced Application is now available to fill out. Please make sure to fill out an application, as breakfast and lunch are no longer free!

You can access the application by going to the following webpage; https://www.psdschools.org/ programs-services/school-meals/free-and-reduced-meals

If your child plans to eat breakfast or lunch at school, but you do not qualify for Free/Reduced, please make sure that your child has money in their SchoolPay account. https://psdschools.schoolpay.com/

Families who qualify for free/reduced school meals, may also be eligible for waivers for certain school fees. Information regarding a student's free/reduced meal status is confidential. Therefore, families must give PSD permission to share this information with staff that need it by completing the Permission to Share Information for Fee Waivers and Programs to Receive Goods and Services form. This form is available electronically through ParentVUE (in the left side navigation - select FORMS.)

All parents will need to sign the Code of Conduct for Poudre School District for the 2022-2023 school year. This is located in Parent VUE. If you do not have access please ask staff in the office for a copy for you to sign!

PSD will follow the state health department's new "How Sick is Too Sick" protocols If you have any of the symptoms listed....You need a negative COVID test to return to school. Symptoms that require a negative test to return to school include fever, feeling feverish, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, sore throat, runny nose, congestion, muscle/body aches, headache, fatigue, new loss of sense of taste or smell.

If your student tests positive or chooses not to test, they must remain home for five days and wear a mask on days 6 to 10 when they return, per public health requirements.

Medical Exemptions: Starting July 1, 2016, parents/quardians seeking non-medical (religious or personal belief) exemptions for children in Kindergarten – 12th Grade must submit nonmedical exemption forms annually. Medical exemptions only need to be submitted once and require the signature of your child's doctor or advanced practice nurse. To submit a nonmedical or medical exemption use the forms below;


